

Psalm 33:13-22 Mark 10:31-44

Psalm 33:13-22 (New Revised Standard Version)

The Lord looks down from heaven; he sees all humankind. From where he sits enthroned he watches all the inhabitants of the earth— he who fashions the hearts of them all, and observes all their deeds. A king is not saved by his great army; a warrior is not delivered by his great strength. The war horse is a vain hope for victory, and by its great might it cannot save. Truly the eye of the Lord is on those who fear him, on those who hope in his steadfast love, to deliver their soul from death, and to keep them alive in famine. Our soul waits for the Lord; he is our help and shield. Our heart is glad in him, because we trust in his holy name. Let your steadfast love, O Lord, be upon us, even as we hope in you.

Mark 10:31-44 (New Revised Standard Version)

"But many who are first will be last, and the last will be first." They were on the road, going up to Jerusalem, and Jesus was walking ahead of them; they were amazed, and those who followed were afraid. He took the twelve aside again and began to tell them what was to happen to him, saying, "See, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be handed over to the chief priests and the scribes, and they will condemn him to death; then they will hand him over to the Gentiles; they will mock him, and spit upon him, and flog him, and kill him; and after three days he will rise again."

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to him and said to him, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." And he said to them, "What is it you want me to do for you?" And they said to him, "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory." But Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?" They replied, "We are able." Then Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am

baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared."

When the ten heard this, they began to be angry with James and John. So Jesus called them and said to them, "You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all.

DEACONS' ANNUAL BURGER FRY

Every year the Deacons have had a burger fry to raise funds for First Presbyterian's emergency assistance program. This is the Deacons' only annual fundraiser.

Last year's burger fry was "virtual". This year we are pleased to announce we will gather in person, but with restrictions to keep everyone safe. We have been given a large donation of McDonald's value meals; plus in a nod to tradition, we will have a small grill for hot dogs for our younger members, and those who prefer hot dogs to burgers. Tables will be set up outside, or members can grab a bag and take it with them.

Taizé Prayer is a worship tradition begun in Taizé France following WWII by Brother Roger, a protestant monk who had experienced the ravages of war and hoped to develop a sense of reconciliation among the people of Europe. The services are completely ecumenical, containing only universal biblical truths about God in Jesus Christ.

The Taizé movement today has grown to be a worldwide mission, especially among Young Adults. Approximately 100,000 pilgrims from all over the world arrive at the Taizé Community annually, and become a part of the daily life there, cleaning, cooking, and serving others during their stay. Small group Bible study and three prayer times a day center on community, hospitality, and worship.

Taizé at First Presbyterian Church helps to train our Choral Scholars and other musicians in this prayerful worship style, preparing them more broadly in the area of church music as they graduate and go into other communities as choral directors and church musicians. Taizé training is part of our College and Young Adult Ministry, and is funded by the Presbytery of Sierra Blanca. The Taizé music heard today in our worship were recently included in a full Taizé Prayer service at Holy Cross Retreat Center Chapel for the Presbytery of Sierra Blanca Pastors' Retreat on October 11.

The congregation is encouraged to sing the chant throughout the song, as voices and instruments interplay with beautiful descants.
