#### **Elders**

#### Lon Anderson (Congregational Life & Outreach Support):

#### Brent Brewer (Buildings & Grounds):

Brent Brewer is a stay-at-home father of two and the Communications Administrator for the Presbytery of Sierra Blanca. He grew up in Seattle, WA. During college as a business major with a concentration in information technologies, he met his wife, Catherine "Catie". They moved three times for her graduate studies at Iowa State University, postdoc in Houston, and, in 2013, faculty position at NMSU in Las Cruces. Brent has served as an Elder twice, once in Iowa, and once at FPC on Buildings & Grounds, and as a Deacon at FPC in 2016. Brent has been a member of and the moderator of the Nominating Committee, in 2018 and 2019, respectively. He also volunteers with sound and video for Sunday services, and as a table parent for Salt & Light.

#### Ada Castle (Christian Education):

I am a "cradle Christian"; I was born into a Christian family so Jesus has always been part of my life. I was born and raised in Iowa but spent most of my adult life in Grand Rapids, Michigan. In 2013 after working 27 years as an administrator at Calvin University, I retired and moved to Elgin, Texas to be near my grandsons. This July we, my daughter, son-in-law, three grandsons and I) moved to Las Cruses to a house capable for all of us to live together. I received a Bachelor of Science degree from Ferris State University in Big Rapids, Michigan and a Certificate In Ministry from Austin Presbyterian Seminary in Austin, Texas.
