Many sternly ordered him to be quiet, but he cried out even more loudly, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" Jesus stood still and said, "Call him here." And they called the blind man, saying to him, "Take heart; get up, he is calling you." So throwing off his cloak, he sprang up and came to Jesus. Then Jesus said to him, "What do you want me to do for you?" The blind

On October 31, 1517, Martin Luther nailed 95 Theses to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg to raise questions about the teaching of the church in his time and look to the Bible for the answers. Though it was not something he planned, it became the beginning of a revolution—one that John Calvin and John Knox continued, and many others followed. The Bible proclaims salvation by Grace through Faith in Christ alone to the Glory of God. These are the five main points of the Reformation, or the Five Solas:

**Sola Gratia (Grace Alone)**: God is motivated to save us by His own love and grace, not by our merits. His heart is for us and His unconditional love is what causes Him to extend to us the free gift of salvation.

**Solus Christus (Christ Alone)**: Jesus is the only mediator between God and humankind. We need no priesthood to connect us with God, only Jesus and His own Spirit in us.

**Sola Scriptura (Scripture Alone)**: How do we know what is true, especially about the character of God and our relationship with Him? The inspired Word of God reveals it. The Word has authority to correct tradition, churches, church councils and all leaders.

**Sola Fide (Faith Alone)**: We are saved by faith, not by works. Our salvation depends on our faith in Christ and what He has done, not on anything we do. Our only work is to believe.

**Soli Deo Gloria (To God's Glory Alone)**: We live into the great affirmation of the Westminster Catechism, "the chief end of man is to glorify God and enjoy Him forever." All we do as followers of Jesus—and as His church—is to bring glory to God alone.
